

CONSEQUENCES FOR INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR

In addition to positive praise and reinforcement that is given when students demonstrate appropriate behaviors, the ROAR program has a clearly defined process for managing inappropriate behaviors. If a student chooses not to follow the ROAR expectations, the procedure below will be followed*:

1. The student will receive a verbal redirection from the teacher.
2. The teacher will redirect the student and re-teach the appropriate behavior.
3. The student will be given a reminder and warned of the possible consequences.
4. The student will be asked to complete a self reflection, which allows the student to take a short break and think about his or her choices. The parent or guardian will also be notified.
5. If the student's behavior does not improve, the student will receive a ROARing Reminder and the student will receive a warning from administration.
6. If the student's behavior still does not improve, administrative action will be taken.

*Please note that certain major infractions require immediate administrative action.

Gale-Bailey continues to implement the ROAR program, which consists of four basic rules that can be applied to all situations and all locations throughout the building. The following is a list of a few examples of expected behavior:

Respectful

Raise hand to speak.
Use polite words.
Ask permission to use things.
Keep areas neat and clean.

Orderly

Keep hands and feet to self.
Use indoor voices.
Wait your turn.

Attentive

Follow directions.
Give attention to the speaker.

Ready to Learn

Bring needed materials.
Report to destination promptly.
Try your best.



LION'S PRIDE TICKETS

Lion's PRIDE tickets are a way for staff at Gale-Bailey to acknowledge positive behaviors displayed by students. When students are following the school rules, they have the opportunity to earn these tickets, which can later be redeemed at the Lion's PRIDE Shop.

Lion's PRIDE tickets do not have a monetary value, they have a "PRIDE" value. The pride is in knowing that they are given and received because of one's commitment to ROAR!

The Lion's PRIDE Shop will be open to each grade level one day a week. Prizes range in value from 10 to 40 tickets and the selection changes each month. The Lion's PRIDE Shop also has a monthly raffle, in which students can participate. Be sure to write your name on your tickets and save them up for big prizes! Students will be allowed to redeem tickets for one prize per visit.



ROARING REWARDS

ROARing Rewards are a way for us to positively reinforce students who remain Office Referral and Bus Referral free for an entire quarter. Students not eligible to enjoy these rewards will participate in an alternate activity during the designated time.
