Debate Club/Team - Debate club

Debate club teaches students a method of formally presenting an argument in a structured manner; we particularly focus on policy debate. Everyone speaks persuasively in their everyday life, whether they are engaging with teachers, parents, friends or co-workers. The skills that serve you well in these conversations are the same that will make you successful in policy debate. In policy debate, the affirmative team proposes an idea, usually something that the government should do. They should describe both how the idea would work, and why it is a good idea. The negative has to prove that the affirmative's proposal is a bad idea, and do not have to offer a proposal of their own. Debate occurs in pairs. Students are identified as the first speaker and the second speaker, and which side of the debate they are arguing. There are two types of speeches, constructives and rebuttals. During a constructive speech, debaters are expected to read lots of evidence and explain the warrants behind their case. During rebuttals, debaters should not use evidence, and instead, should draw comparisons and explain why their ideas are superior. We are always looking for new members and we are trying to expand our club into a competitive team.

Mock Trial

Mock Trial Team Meeting - Since 1983, Maryland high school students have been arguing in courts throughout the state. What are they arguing? Why, the law of course! At the center of each year's competition is a new legal case - either civil or criminal in nature - that challenges students to think critically about timely issues. Acting as attorneys and witnesses, students portray defense or plaintiff/prosecution and are scored on their performances by judges or attorneys. The program's objectives are to (1) Further understanding of the law, court procedures, and the legal system; (2) Increase proficiency in soft skills such as listening, speaking, reading and reasoning; (3) Heighten appreciation for academic studies as well as career consciousness of law-related professions. Competitions take place at the local level - within each of the eight judicial circuits in Maryland - from January through March. The teams with the "winning-est" record from each of the circuits advance to the Regionals; those that prevail in the Regionals advance to Annapolis as part of the Final Four. At the invitation of the Maryland State Bar Association, the sponsor of the Mock Trial Competition, the top four teams stay overnight in Annapolis, where they will compete in the Semi-Finals and potentially advance to the State Championship. Mock Trial team members meet to discuss the case prior to competitions. Interested students are encouraged to attend to see if they want to try out for the upcoming year. We are always looking to expand our team and prepare for future years.
