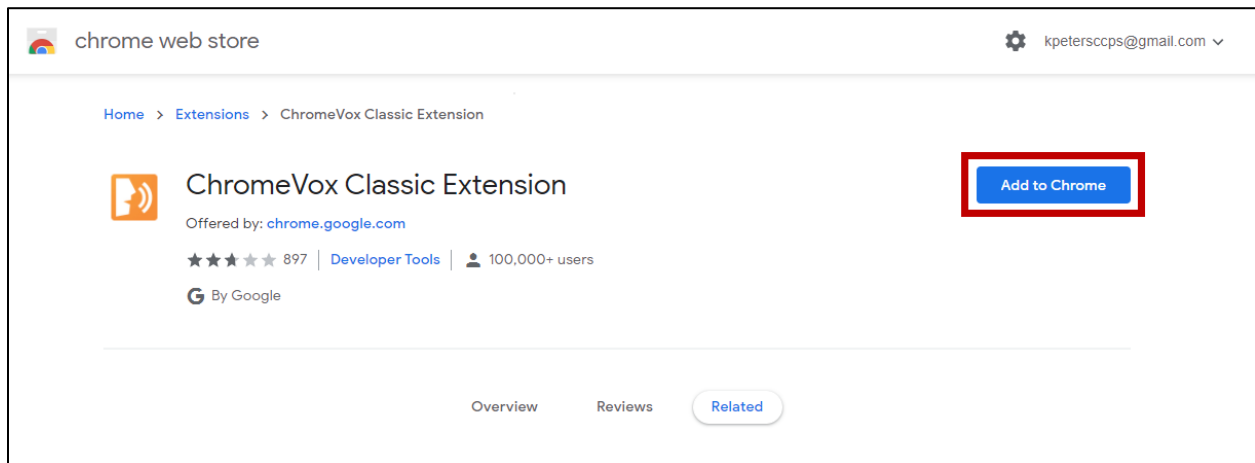
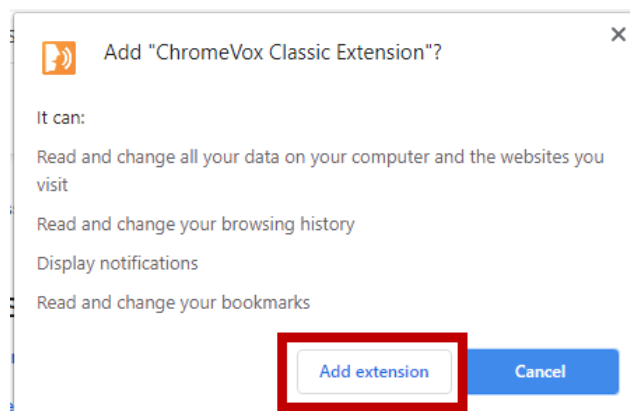


Text-To-Speech ChromeVox Tool in Chrome Browser

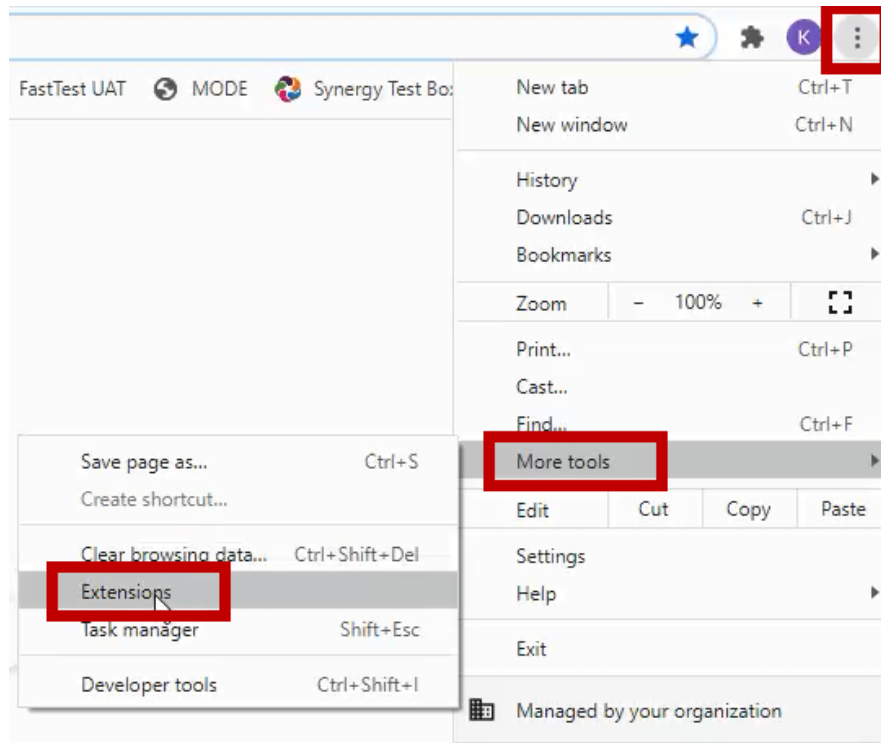
1. ChromeVox is a Google Chrome extension that needs to be added to the browser on each device. Students and teachers with CCPS devices should both be able to add the extension to Chrome on their device.
2. Open your Chrome browser.
3. Go to <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/detail/chromevox-classic-extension/kgejglhpijefppelpmljglcjbhoiplfn?hl=en>.
4. For ChromeVox Classic Edition, click the “Add to Chrome” button. If you already have ChromeVox installed, the button will say “Remove from Chrome” and you can skip to step #7 to turn on the extension.



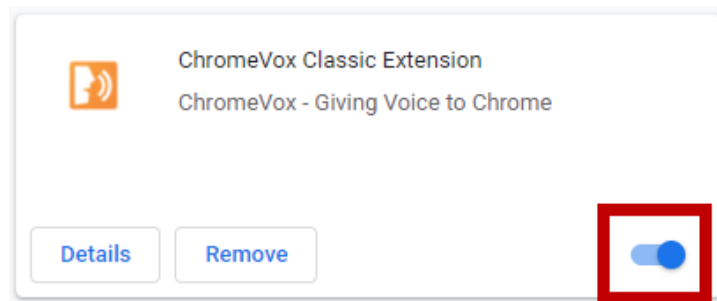
5. In the next window, click the “Add extension” button.



- Once installed, ChromeVox will automatically read the text on the screen.
- To turn the ChromeVox tool on or off, click on the three dots in the top right corner of your screen to open the menu, click on “More tools” and then click on “Extensions.”

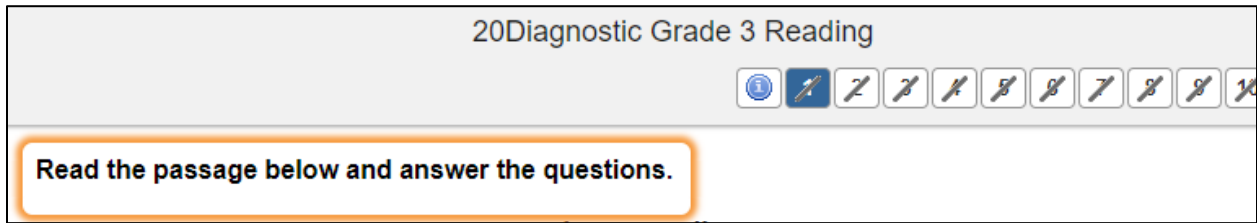


- A new tab will open with all your extensions, and you can click on the blue toggle to turn the tool on and off.



- Once ChromeVox is installed, log into websites as usual and the screen reader will automatically begin reading the text on the screen.

10.If a student clicks on specific text, an orange box will appear around the text and the audio will begin.



NOTE: ChromeVox will read everything aloud in the browser including when the cursor clicks on something. It narrates what the user is doing when navigating a site, and then reads the text on the screen. Students may want to turn off the tool when it's not needed.
